It's a sad time of year when we must put away our classics for their 'hibernation', but remember that we can all still get together with our Alfa friends during the colder months. Winter is a great time to host a 'tech session', a holiday party or a social dinner.

Raduno Montebello - 2nd annual Italian car gathering was a resounding success!

Sometimes, the stars all line up and the weather and other factors all work out perfectly... and that is exactly what happened on Sunday, the 28th of September for the second annual Raduno Montebello, a gathering of Italian (and Italian-related) cars at Le Chateau Montebello. Raduno Montebello is a car show without trophies or prizes, and is put on annually as part of the "AMICI" group of Italian and related auto clubs. This group of clubs has helped coordinate club event schedules and organize some terrific multi-club events.

Approximately 200 beautiful cars, some new and some as old as 1954 (our own Oliver Collins' 'Alfa Romeo 1900 Touring Coupe') gathered from Montreal, Ottawa and as far away as the GTA on the well-manicured lawns of Chateau Montebello on a gorgeous and warm early autumn day. Some participants enjoyed the lovely brunch offered at the hotel, while others either brought their own picnic or ate at nearby restaurants before or after joining the event.

Montreal area cars came out in full force, with many members of Club Fiat Montreal, the Ferrari Club of America (Quebec Chapter), Club Alfa Romeo de Montreal and several other clubs meeting in a parking lot in Montreal North and then setting out in small groups to steer towards Montebello. Joining their Ontario counterparts at the Chateau's beautiful water-surrounded peninsula, cars were parked in a surprisingly orderly manner, befitting their elegance and for all to see. The Italian Car Club of Ottawa and the Ottawa Alfa Romeo Club and others assured that the National Capital area was well-represented as well. I am not sure how many attendees came from other areas including the GTA and Quebec City, but I know at least three Alfa owners drove the long distance to bring their Italian steeds. For me, among all the exotic and rare machinery, which included such diverse models as both a De Tomaso Mangusta and a Longchamps, a Maserati-powered Citroen SM, a Renault R8 'Gordini' (both French cars prepared with Italian assistance), a Maserati Khamsin and an Alfa Romeo 8C Competizione Spider, as well as just about every model of Ferrari newer than 1968, I would still choose Oliver Collins' Alfa 1900 as my favourite car in the show!

Restoration Garage

Over the years, I've sporadically followed the now prolific genre of television shows covering the subject of automobile restoration or modification. It's not news that these programs are plagued with indifferent to poor acting, contrived situations and interpersonal conflicts, and impossible deadlines. One of the best uses I've found for my PVR is to record these programs and flip through them later seeking out the interesting parts and skipping through the rest.

Restoration Garage is about the activities of the Guild of Automotive Restorers in Bradford, so it's Canadian (yay!) and has a location any of us in the Toronto area can drive by and drop in on if we're so inclined. Despite the fact that this program is no better than any of the others for the sins mentioned above, there has been some content of interest to Alfa enthusiasts.

Last season, a couple of episodes featured the GT Junior owned by Faisal Huda as it went through a down-to-the-body shell repair and re-painting process. Although they treated the car and its owner with respect, the writers and producers never twigged to how special this Alfaholics enhanced GT Jr. is. Those episodes left me feeling a little empty.

This season, the restoration of a Pininfarina 6C 2500 has been the subject of a couple of episodes, and I'm guessing that at least one more is coming.

The second episode deals with a trip to Italy taken by the Guild's proprietor, ostensibly for the sole purpose of sourcing a pair of original Carello trafficator signal lights.

Despite some staged stress over a local driver who improbably shows up as a whimsical fellow in a '71 Fiat 500L, the episode comes through with a few scenes that are gems to an enthusiast.

The first is a visit to AFRA in search of the trafficator lights. I have purchased a limited number of parts from AFRA and it was good to see the location, their office and a bit of their shop. No luck on the trafficators, though. The ones AFRA had were in need of restoration and the time required just wasn't going to work. Fortunately the driver had a cousin Pino who had a friend who knows Salvatore Diamante who just happened to have a pair of the desired trafficators on hand and for sale.

The second gem is a visit to the headquarters and an interview with Paulo Pininfarina, the company's current chairman. The cars on display in the reception area include a Giulietta and the 2uettotanta prototype, among Lancias, Ferraris and a Cisitalia.

The story of the subject 6C 2500 was reviewed. It seems Italian cars being banned from post-war auto shows wasn't much of an impediment to Battista Pininfarina. He simply parked the car outside the exhibition hall and basked in the attention that this radically styled Alfa generated. The third gem was a scene involving flogging the 500 around the test track on top of the Fiat factory in Turin. I wonder what strings the producer had to pull to arrange that!

Other snippets of interest in this episode were scenes of the fabrication of replacement cloisonné badges and making up a replacement wheel cover by hand. If anyone wants to check this episode out for themselves, it's on the History Channel's web site, season 2 episode 2.
